### President's report

It was great to see so many members present at our last meeting to hear Law Professor Al Gillespie speak about the way in which the Christchurch Mosque shootings have changed New Zealand permanently. We have lost our innocence and sense of safety and cannot go back to the way we were before. He addressed some of the complexities of the shooting and its aftermath. He explained how the attacker was legally able to buy guns here which are banned in Australia. He outlined the implications of charging the perpetrator with terrorism as well as murder. The terrorism charge will allow him to defend himself and give him an international voice. He also noted how highly the Prime Minister's response in the aftermath of the shooting was regarded overseas.

Along with this newsletter you will receive a copy of our Health and Safety Policy and Evacuation Procedures. Please read them. We still have work to do to flesh out all our policies and will keep members posted. We are seeking volunteers with a background in medicine or first aid and volunteers who would be prepared to undertake training in the use of the Church defibrillator. A training session is planned for November.

U3A Hamilton has a new website which we hope will provide easily accessible information about our activities. We are interested in feedback.

Coming events include the bus trip to Ayrlires, the garden in Whitford, a trip to the zoo which will include a close up encounter with the giraffes, and a trip to the Hamilton Gardens to see the newly developed areas.
