The Antiques and Collectables group

We began the year's programme by meeting at Paul Etheridge's home in Te Pahu. Paul gave us a fascinating insight into coin collecting. We examined several coins including some from Roman times where the detail of the raised relief on the coins was impressive. We were provided with comprehensive notes which included the appropriate vocabulary of the subject, values of old coins, conditions or grades and buying and selling. Paul also offered the following advice:

Keeping Coins for the Grandchildren

You might want to keep a set of the coins that are being withdrawn for your grandchildren. Here are some hints if you choose to do so.

- Select coins that are bright and shiny and have few marks on them
- Keep separately in envelopes so that they do not knock against each other
- Store carefully in dry conditions
- Note that coins should only be cleaned by washing gently in soapy water and dried carefully
- Never polish coins – the surface is destroyed and the value decreased
- Coin envelopes and other storage items are available – see the Premier Catalogue for advertisements

Philosophy Group


New convenor needed from May.


